TRANSPORTATION	The district provides transportation from home before period 1 and to home after period 3 . Bus passes will be emailed to you before the program begins. Shuttle buses from GNPS Recreation Camp sites will be available for students taking Beginning Music (Pd. 3 ONLY).

ELEMENTARY, GRADES 1-5

ELEMENTARY CLASSES for GRADES 1, 2, AND 3 (THREE-HOUR BLOCK)

An exciting "full day" experience (3 hours) for our youngest students!

Children will spend their morning honing their skills in reading, writing and math, all while building a sense of community and preparing for the new school year.

This is a great opportunity to get used to the elementary day!

Classes will also involve 45 minutes of daily push-in enrichment - music, Spanish, and more!

MATH 4

Preview important concepts that will be covered in 4th grade Math!

Availability: Period 1 (8:30 am – 9:30 am) OR Period 3 (10:30 am – 11:30 am)

LITERACY 4

Prepare for 4th grade reading and writing in this two-hour block!

Availability: Periods 1 AND 2 (8:30 am – 10:30 am) OR Periods 2 AND 3 (9:30 am – 11:30 am)

MATH 5

Get ready for fifth grade math! We will cover place value, reading and writing numbers up to ten million and expressing them in various forms (standard, numerical, and word); comparing and ordering numbers; and problem solving!

Availability: Period 1 (8:30 am – 9:30 am) OR Period 3 (10:30 am – 11:30 am)

ELA 5 (English Language Arts)

Get ready for fifth grade! Students will enhance their ability to analyze and respond to text in writing, engage in meaningful discussions about figurative language and author's purpose, and grow their vocabulary.

Availability: Period 2 (9:30 am – 10:30 am)

BEGINNER MUSIC: Woodwinds, Strings, or Brass (choose a category based on instrument)

SCIENCE



ASTRONOMY

Welcome to the wonderful world of astronomy! Together we will learn about our planet, the solar system, galaxy, and universe. We will use the tools that astronomers use to explore the different objects found in space. Get ready to explore the cosmos this summer!

ENRICHMENT BIOLOGY

Learn the basics of living things, including cells and the human body systems. This course explores many areas of biology! A great intro course for any students in all grade levels interested in biology, and *especially recommended for students entering 9th Grade at South High.*

ENRICHMENT EARTH SCIENCE

Learn about how the earth works! In this class, we will explore major units of the rigorous 8th grade Earth Science curriculum, which all incoming eighth graders will take in September. Join us in Earth Science and start the year with confidence! *This course is strongly recommended for incoming eighth graders at both North Middle and South Middle School, and is taught by a current 8th grade Earth Science teacher in our district.*

FORENSIC SCIENCE

Do you have what it takes to become a forensic scientist? Are you excited to examine evidence and catch some criminals? Learn the scientific processes and procedures involved in solving crimes... we'll study fingerprinting, DNA analysis, evidence patterns, document authentication, and more!

Come and learn history of American conflict. From the pre Revolutionary War to Afghanistan and everything in between, we'll discuss some of the most significant conflicts in US history and their effects on our modern society today. **Availability: Period 2**

HISTORY: REAL TO REEL

United States history has been the subject of countless debates, interpretations, and reenactments. While we take social studies and read non-fiction in school, some people have only been exposed to U.S. history through Hollywood... but is this portrayal of American history always accurate? How has US history been handled? What impression are people around the world left with after viewing a movie like *The Patriot*? What can we learn from examining our past through film? These questions and more will be discussed. **Availability: Period 3**

NEW!!!

THE ANCIENT WORLD

Do you love history and learning about the civilizations that came before us? Let's time travel back to ancient world, where we'll learn about ancient civilizations such as the Phoenicians, Minoans & Mycenaeans, Olmecs, Toltecs, Ancestral Pueblo, Persia, and more! Available for all ages but especially incoming sixth graders who will learn about other ancient civilizations in the fall. **Availability: Period 1**

THE LAW AND YOU

How much do you know about US law? Learn about the Bill of Rights, the Supreme Court, and other aspects of our legal system and what your individual rights mean for everyday life. We will focus on the legal process of what happens from the time of arrest through all the motions of the legal system and trial verdicts. A great course for those who are passionate about law. **Availability: Period 3**

WEIRD & WILD EVENTS

Who shot JFK? What happened to the lost colonists of Roanoke? What happens when a volcano erupts or when a tsunami strikes? In this class, you will learn about the impact of famous natural disasters and you will solve famous historical mysteries, all while reinforcing your research skills! **Availability: Period 3**

SOCIAL STUDIES 8 (American History 8)

Compare the geography of the USA to the world at large to foster a greater appreciation of our country and the rest of planet Earth. This class will focus on civics education, structure of government, as well as research skills and the elements of the 8th grade social studies curriculum. **Availability: Period 1**

BUSINESS AND FINANCE



BULLS, BEARS & DREAMS

How would you invest \$100,000? Learn about the "Bulls" and "Bears" of the stock market. Follow your personal portfolio daily and learn how to buy, sell, and hold stocks. **Availability: Period 2**

BUSINESS PROJECT

Create a real-life practical business plan for your own community. Practice roles of actual small businesses, including architecture, CEO, accounting, marketing, advertising, & interior design. **Availability: Period 1**

PERSONAL FINANCE

Do you want to save money for college? Or have you thought about investing? Can you tell the difference between a debit and credit card? And do you dream of an early retirement? This course will provide students with an early path to becoming financially literate and engage with topics in an exciting and tangible way via the use of projects and games. **Availability: Period 1 or 2**



ENGLISH, READING, AND WRITING



INTRO TO 6th GRADE TC READING

Prepare for sixth grade! First, we will focus on the deep study of character. We will read short stories and watch movie shorts to study complex character traits, how setting influences characters, and how characters help us determine theme. Then, we will practice the fundamentals of nonfiction reading to prepare for the nonfiction unit. Finally, we will work on the mandatory 6th grade summer reading assignment due the first week of school.

*Students **must** have a copy of their chosen summer reading novel.*

Availability: Period 2

WRITING 6

Sharpen your reading and writing skills to prepare for the high expectations for success in middle school. We will review skills such as vocabulary development, sentence structure, as well as paragraph and essay writing.

Availability: Period 1, 2 or 3

INTRO TO 7th GRADE READING

Prepare for seventh grade! We will focus on the TC reading units of annotating for the elements of character, conflict, setting, theme, challenges, and connections, which are all part of the characterization reading unit. We will practice double entry journals and will preview minilessons used during the Historical Fiction reading unit.

We will also work on the mandatory 7th grade summer reading assignment. *Students **must** have a copy of their chosen summer reading novel.*

Availability: Period 2

INTRO TO 7th GRADE TC WRITING

Prepare for seventh grade! We will focus on two of the main 7th grade TC Units of Study for writing: Literary Essay and Independent Research Projects. Students will hone their literary essay writing skills. They will develop their own thesis statements, write strong introductions, explain and analyze text evidence, and focus on ending essays with powerful conclusions. They will develop their own mini research projects and focus on researching and annotating, note-taking, and synthesizing their notes into writing about a topic.

Availability: Period 1 or 3

ENGLISH 8

This course is designed for students entering 8th grade in the fall. Explore various themes of literature and express yourself through creative writing. We will practice text and literary analysis, different writing styles, and we will also explore popular topics in English 8.

Availability: Period 3

ENGLISH 9

Read and discuss literature on a high school level to sharpen your analytical skills. We will read selections from popular high school texts and explore a variety of literary situations. Learn to write expressively and confidently as you prepare for high school.

Availability: Period 1

READING 8 AND 9

Make sure you're ready for high school with this introductory course. Learn and practice skills that make literary analysis and reading comprehension easier for you.

Availability: Period 2

GRAPHIC NOVELS

Develop your reading and writing skills through the study of graphic novels! Learn the language that is necessary to reading and understanding graphic novels. Enhance your literary skills as you create your own graphic novel (either digitally or by hand). Develop the story arc, create the panels of a full graphic novel book, and design your own pages. You will take home your very own unique graphic novel!

ONCE UPON A GENRE: UNRAVELING THE THREADS OF FAIRY TALES

Explore the rich history and cultural significance of fairy tales. Dissect their timeless themes, archetypal characters, and enduring magic. We will unravel the intricate themes that weave these timeless tales together, while exploring the symbolism, imagery, and magic realism embedded in these enchanting narratives. We will also explore creative writing as we make our own fairy tales. A great class to practice our reading, writing, and creativity!

Learn the fundamentals of residential design. Design a one-story home to scale. Use Computer Aided Design software to render professional-style designs.

Explore the art of clay! Learn specific techniques to create a vase, jewelry box, small animal sculptures, and other unique designs!

CLAYMATION (Grades 4-9)

Make your own animated film from start to finish! Create stories with clay sculptures that come to life with iStop and iMovie on the iPad!

Do you love to paint? Learn the secrets of the Masters of Art such as Monet and Georgia O'Keeffe... 5 artists in 5 weeks!

ROBOTICS – LEGO ROBOTICS (Beginner)

Design, build, and operate your own mechanical robot out of Legos. Then, participate in a variety of robot competitions, including robot races, capture the flag matches, and our always popular Battle of the Bots! We will use EV3 kits and the brand-new Spike Prime kits to build and program. Taught by the award winning Robotics coach at North Middle.

Availability: Period 1

ROBOTICS – TETRIS ROBOTICS (Advanced)

Students will design, build, and operate robots based on the Tetrix robotic system. These aluminum based robots are the basis of the FIRST Tech Challenge competition, so prior experience with any robotics is recommended. The class will build their versatile robots while learning about the structural components, drivebase motors and various servos. The class will include head to head competition and various obstacle courses. Taught by the lead mentor of the award winning South High School Rebel Robotics Team.

MATHEMATICS



COMPETITION MATH for Grades 6-9 only

Feel like winning a different kind of tournament? Participants will work on challenging math problems from these competitions: MATHCOUNTS, AMC 8, NEW YORK MATH LEAGUE, and Purple Comet. Working on these problems will build students' problem solving skills and prepare them for next year's competitions! Taught by the coach of the 2024 New York State Mathcounts Team, and designed for students in grades 6 through 9, this course ends each week with a fun, friendly team competition that students always enjoy!

Availability: Period 2

MATH CHALLENGE for Grades 5 and 6 only

Math can be playful, beautiful, competitive, and thought-provoking. In this course, students will explore mathematical concepts found in art and design, games, nature, and language. Students can expect to be challenged with activities that explore math through a new lens and problems and puzzles that require multiple strategies flexible, outside-the-box thinking, and a persistent mindset.

Availability: Period 2

INTRO TO MATH 5 (only for incoming 5th graders who are enrolled in Math 5)

Get ready for fifth grade math! We will cover place value, reading and writing numbers up to ten million and expressing them in various forms (standard, numerical, and word); comparing and ordering numbers; and problem solving!

Availability: Period 1 or 3

INTRO TO MATH 6 (only for incoming 6th graders who are enrolled in Math 6)

Get ready for rigorous middle school math! Topics include: solving problems involving ratio and rate; operations with fractions and decimals; expressions and equations; statistics; and developing problem-solving skills involving real-world situations.

Availability: Period 1 or 3

INTRO TO EP MATH 6 (only for incoming 6th graders who are enrolled in EP Math 6)

Get a head start on the problem-solving skills needed to succeed in rigorous EP Math 6! Topics include: integer operations; solving algebraic equations and inequalities; the concept of a function; ratios and proportional reasoning; percents; and statistics.

Availability: Period 1, 2, or 3

INTRO TO MATH 7 (only for incoming 7th graders who are enrolled in Math 7)

Get ready for 7th grade! Topics include: translating word phrases and sentences into mathematical expressions; integer operations; solving and graphing equations and inequalities; functions; percents; ratios and proportional reasoning; and statistics.

Availability: Period 2 or 3

INTRO TO PRE-ALGEBRA (EP 7)

(only for incoming 7th graders who are enrolled in Pre-Algebra (EP Math 7))

Gain the problem-solving skills to succeed in rigorous Pre-Algebra! Topics include: solving linear equations and their systems; concepts of functions and using functions to describe quantitative relationships; analyzing two- and three-dimensional space; and applying the Pythagorean theorem.

Availability: Period 1 or 3

INTRO TO MATH 8 (PRE-ALGEBRA 8)

(only for incoming 8th graders who are enrolled in Pre-Algebra 8 (Math 8))

Set yourself up for success with a preview of 8th grade math! Topics include: solving linear equations and their systems; concepts of functions and using functions to describe quantitative relationships; analyzing two- and three-dimensional space; and applying Pythagorean theorem.

Availability: Period 1 or 2

INTRO TO ALGEBRA I (MATH 9) (only for incoming 9th graders OR incoming 8th graders in Algebra I)

Get a head start this summer on Algebra I! Topics include: solving multi-step equations and inequalities; working with and graphing a variety of different types of functions; solving word problems involving both functions and systems of equations; and using a graphing calculator efficiently.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

Transportation will **ONLY provided home** at 2:00pm and 4:00pm, but **not** to the program.

- If students are in the morning enrichment program and take Jazz Band, they can stay on campus until Jazz Band begins (please bring lunch).
- If students are in the morning enrichment program and take Chamber Music, they must take the bus home at 11:30 and must be brought back to campus for Chamber Music to begin; they cannot stay on campus.
- If students are not in morning enrichment, they must be driven to school by the program's start time.

If students are not in the morning enrichment program, they must be driven on their own in time for the program to start at 11:45am.

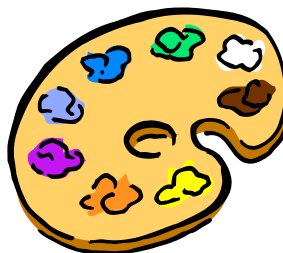
