Enrollment and Offerings - Middle School

- 72 courses offered to grades 5-9 (8:30 11:30 am)
- Enrichment students had opportunities to explore their interests in: filmmaking, rocketry, robotics, 3-D printing, coding, cooking, business, chess, the stock market, law, acting, sewing, public speaking, manga anatomy, architecture, clay animation, music, physics, forensics... and more!
- Academic enrichment was provided in social studies, English, math, science, literacy, and reading
- New courses: Becoming a 7th Grader; History's Mysteries

Enrollment and Offerings - Elementary School

- 91 students enrolled in our elementary program this year
- Our **eight courses** included:

 - Reading 2
 - Reading 3
 - Literacy 4
 - Literacy 5
 - o Math 3
 - Math 4
 - Math 5


First Aid students became certified in CPR/AED for Adult, Infant, and Child!



Forensic Science, Physics, and English classes collaborated to solve a "crime" at North Middle; they collected evidence, studied fingerprint, and interrogated potential suspects









Enrollment and Offerings - High School

- Fourteen high school classes were offered for credit recovery
- A total of 260 Regents exams were administered across ten different subject areas, including the first ever summer administration of the new Global History II (New Framework) exam
- Nine Regents review classes were offered from August 1 12
- Our high school program is open to Garden City students, and this summer we enrolled 66 students from Garden City (including 3 for credit recovery, 8 for Regents review, and 64 for the Regents)

ENL - English as a New Language

 The ENL courses for grades 1-2, 3-5, 6-8, and high school are divided based on the NYSITELL and NYSESLAT proficiency levels

 We register currently enrolled ENL students based on their ENL teacher's recommendation

Aspirations for Summer 2020

- Extend the elementary enrichment program to include two-period or three-period day options for Grades 1, 2, and 3 (e.g., extending time spent on reading, introducing math classes for Grades 1 and 2)
- Secure space and staff for possible new courses based on community and student interest
 - o Expanded offerings at the elementary level
 - o Broader offerings in mathematics
 - o Foreign language courses
- Divide larger ENL sections into smaller, more responsive ones:
 - o Old: Elementary ENL (grade 3-5) and Middle School ENL (grade 6-8)
 - o New: Grade 3-4 ENL, Grade 5-6 ENL, and Grade 7-8 ENL
