Syosset board makes Muslim, Hindu festivals school holidays







Where it all Began

Syed said before the vote that making a Muslim holy day a holiday "sends a good message because **Syosset is so diverse.**"

School board approval would teach the "values of different cultures and religions so that we can respect each other."

Muslim leaders collected more than **700 signatures** on their request to make two major Muslim holy days — Eid al-Fitr, which marks the end of the holy month of Ramadan, and Eid al-Adha, or the Feast of Sacrifice — school holidays.

"We are thrilled," said Dr. Uzma Syed, who led the petition drive. "We are so happy we were able to work together."

Board President Michael Cohen said he pushed fellow members to reach a decision Monday night.

In many instances, the holidays can fall during weekends, federal holidays or summer breaks. Other times, the holidays can fall during a regular school day. 

NY Senate Bill S151





The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

8-c. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for purposes of any

calculation under subdivision seven or sight of this section, the commissioner shall disrepard any reduction resulting from chearvance of Eld al-Pite. Eld al-Dubba. Diwall. and Chasm and. If necessary, such chearved holidays shall be nacluciated an assaich days.

§ 3. This act shall take effect on the first of July next succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law.

There are approximately 1.8 billion Muslims around the world who observe and celebrate the month of Ramadan and the holiday Eld. In the United States, Islam is the third largest religion with an estimate of 3.45 million Muslim.
