Happy Mother's Day

Maybe it was the TV advertising where moms were portrayed as lacking if their kids' socks were not pearly white, the house wasn't perfect, makeup was messy, and the coffee was not "good to the last drop." Nowadays, there are plenty of "perfect" Facebook mothers, who seem to keep everything perfectly balanced with the grace and beauty of a swan.

Our mom, Shirley Fay, was perfect... because she wasn't.
