A Note About School-Issued Laptops (Unreturning Students, Take Note)

Before you drop off:

2. Secure and back up any important information and files.
3. Remove and sign out of your personal Apple ID.

The Tech Department will factory reset the device, remove all school-licensed apps, and return the laptop to you. Your school-issued email, Veracross, and Google accounts will be disconnected at the end of the day on Friday, May 24.
