Here are a few of our February highlights:

### Medford Launching Green Line District Parking Pilot Program



The City will be transitioning a roughly quarter mile radius encompassing Medford's two GLX stops into districtwide area permit parking, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The pilot program will replace the street-bystreet residential permit parking system.

Parking and traffic officials will hold a public meeting via zoom on Wednesday, March 13 at 6 p.m. to give a full overview of the Green Line Zone parking program. We will take questions from residents after the presentation. Details of the meeting, including the zoom link, will be available on the City's website.

#### Medford Installing Five New Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

The City has installed new electric vehicle (EV) charging stations at five high priority locations across the community, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The installation projects are funded by a \$167,000 grant from the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection's Massachusetts Electric Vehicle Incentive Program (MassEVIP).

Level 2 ChargePoint stations are located at the Yale Street lot, West Medford lot, Tufts Park, Roberts Elementary, and Brooks Elementary.

### Medford Releases GIS Maps of Traffic and Pedestrian Safety Projects



The City has secured a \$300,000 grant to expand public outreach and strengthen support specifically for underrepresented and underserved communities interested in decarbonizing their homes and vehicles through energy efficiency; solar; and electrification of heating, water heating, appliances, and electric vehicles, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The grant is from the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center's (MassCEC) <u>EmPower Massachusetts</u> <u>program</u>.

EmPower Massachusetts invests in community-focused programs that provide access to the benefits of clean energy or reduce energy burden for previously underserved or vulnerable populations in the Commonwealth. Medford's program, Electrify Medford, will seek to educate residents on available resources and help them make these changes in their own homes.

#### Medford Launches Black Health Series Throughout 2024 Focusing on Social Detriments to Health

The City will host its Black Health Series events from February 2024 through June 2024, covering both physical and mental health topics directly affecting the Black community.

In collaboration with healthcare professionals, community leaders, and subject matter experts, the Black Health Series aims to raise awareness throughout the community about how racial health disparities have harmed generations of Black Americans.

The series will cover a wide range of topics through the five events, including maternal health, cardiovascular health, Alzheimer's, asthma in children, men's health, mental wellbeing, and more.

#### Medford Offering Discounted Rain Barrels for 2024 Season

The City of Medford is again offering

The City has released GIS maps of bicycle and transit transportation enhancement projects across the community, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. Projects noted on the maps include bus and bike lanes, Bluebike stations, traffic calming measures, crosswalk improvements, and more. The maps were created and designed by the City's GIS Coordinator Steve Morse.

Under the Mayor's direction, the Traffic and Transportation division of the Engineering Department has been investing in upgrades to Medford's roadway infrastructure to improve safety and usability and expand mobility options beyond driving. The maps are available to be viewed

#### City Launching Review of Medford Fire Sick-Time Usage and Resulting Overtime Costs

The City is conducting a review of firefighter sick leave usage after the majority of scheduled firefighters called out sick for a portion of their 24-hour shift in the first long weekend of February. On Saturday Feb. 3rd alone, twenty-one (21) fire fighters out of twenty-three (23) called out sick. Over the five-day period, this triggered costs to the City of over \$92,000—over \$58,000 of which was overtime.

#### Medford to Open Extensive Search for Next Fire Chief

Chief John Freedman is retiring after nearly 30 years of service with the fire department, the last two years as Chief, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The City has begun its search for a new Chief to lead the Medford Fire Department and to serve the community.

The city will be looking for candidates that will bring unique perspectives and wide-ranging experiences to this position. residents access to discounted rain barrels through vendor partner, The Great American Rain Barrel (TGARB) for 2024, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The barrels are being offered at \$84 for unpainted and \$89 for painted/colors. Orders must be submitted by April 28 at midnight and picked up at the distribution event on Wednesday, May 8 from 5pm-7pm at Medford High School.

"Our community continues to feel the effects of climate change as we have seen significant rain fall this past year," said Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn. "By continuing this cost-friendly eco conscious solution for our residents, we can better help mitigate flooding events in our streets, provide a sustainable water source for our plant life, and reduce our demand on public water systems."

#### Medford Residents Have Recycled 892 Pounds of Unwanted Clothing in February

Through its partnership with Helpsy, a textile recycling company, the city has been able to help residents recycle 892 pounds of unwanted clothing in February.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.

As part of its environmental mission, Helpsy now requires a three bag minimum for pickups. The company is optimizing routes in order to use resources as wisely as possible and reduce environmental impact.
