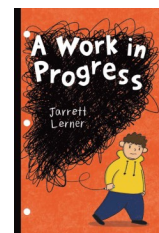
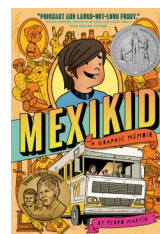
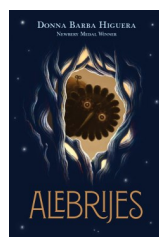
Students are encouraged to:
