The Harbor Method is a whole school approach designed to educate children to be capable and caring graduates ready for the next level of their education.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Summer meals alleviate food insecurity and hunger in those children most in need when meals are not available through the NSLP. Accordingly, federal regulation [7 CFR 210.12 \(d\)\(2\)](#) requires School food authorities (SFAs) to cooperate with [Summer Food Service Program](#) (SFSP) sponsors to distribute materials to inform families of the availability and location of free SFSP meals for students when school is not in session.

This requirement is often accomplished by hanging promotional posters, sending home flyers, or including blurbs in newsletters. Whenever possible, SFAs should attempt to promote SFSP meal locations through social media.

It is requested that SFAs utilize the [Summer Meals Site Finder](#) mapping tool to find nearby meal sites. Developer tools are available so that the map can be accessed from the SFA's website. Families can use this tool to find directions to nearby meal sites, as well as their hours of operation and contact information. No Kid Hungry also offers a [Free Meal Finder](#). SFAs can easily spread the word by advertising that families can find free meals by [texting "FOOD" or "COMIDA" to 304-304](#).

Promoting the availability of summer meals meets program requirements and assists families.
