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## **Transition Planning Timeline**

The path leading to a successful transition from childhood to adulthood should begin much earlier than the teenage years. It starts when children learn about themselves, their strengths, and weaknesses. As a student approaches the time to leave high school, it is essential that preparations for adult life are well underway. The following is a series of events that may need to be considered during the student's transition process. The list is provided as a guideline and planning tool. All items will not be applicable to all students.

Apply for OPWDD services	Elementary - high school
Administer initial vocational assessment	12
Complete periodic vocational assessments	12-21
Develop a career plan	12-21 (any age)
Consider employment/volunteer experience	14-21
Participate in strength-based person centered planning	12-21
