

- The first set of hours (15 hours) can be completed during or after Freshman year, and are due no later than September 1st of Sophomore year.
- The second set of hours (30 additional hours, 45 total) must be completed and approved by September 1st of Junior year.
- The third set of hours (30 additional hours as the completion of 75 total hours) must be completed and approved by September 1st of Senior year.
