

Important Information from the Massachusetts Attorney General's Office on Youth Summer Jobs

As Massachusetts teenagers prepare for summer jobs, the Attorney General's Office encourages educators to help minors stay safe at work. The Massachusetts Attorney General's Office enforces the Massachusetts youth employment laws, including the work permit laws. By issuing work permits, schools play an important role in keeping young workers safe. Please review this flowchart summarizing the work permit process. Should you have any further questions about work permits, please contact the Department of Labor Standards (www.mass.gov/dols).

<u>This parent letter</u> encourages parents and teens to talk about workplace safety and informs teens about their rights as employees. FAFSA Information for Seniors from DESE

There is still time for college-bound students to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and apply to colleges for the fall! This year's new FAFSA has been challenging for many people, but, with a historic amount of financial aid on the table, the form is worth the effort. Recently, the Department of Higher Education extended the priority deadline for MASSGrant applications until July 1 in recognition of this year's challenges.

By completing the FAFSA, students automatically apply for MASSGrant Plus, which was expanded by the Healey-Driscoll Administration in the fall. This program offers Pell Grant-eligible students free tuition and fees at all of Massachusetts' public colleges and universities, along with a \$1,200 allowance for books and supplies. Room and board are not included. There are also benefits for middle-income students.

Students who cannot fill out the FAFSA due to their immigration status can complete the newly launched Massachusetts Application for State Financial Aid (MASFA). Learn more at https://www.mass.edu/tuitionequity/home.asp.

- Session 3 (Programs starting July 28): May 31st, 2024

Rising 10th - 12th graders in high school are eligible to attend the program. To apply, students will need:

• A brief, 1-page statement of interest

- An unofficial high school transcript
- A letter of recommendation from a teacher or school counselor

Lillian B. Lamoureux Music Scholarship Competition


The Lillian B. Lamoureux Music Scholarship competition is open to all South Coast music students ages 14-21. Two \$1,000 scholarships are awarded annually, one to a high school student and one to a college student. Scholarships may be used for private music lessons, tuition, or other expenses that further the student's music education. The scholarship, awarded by the NBSO since 2000, continues to recognize the legacy of former President Emerita and longtime board President Lillian B. Lamoureux.

The 2024 Lamoureux Scholarship Application is <u>here</u>. Please note that they have eliminated the requirement to provide a video audition and letters of recommendation. The only requirement is that the high school student and college student be from the South Coast area. The application deadline is **May 16**, **2024**.
