What is the National Board Certification?

- Founded in 1987 as an independent, nonprofit organization working to advance accomplished teachers for all students
- Recognized as the gold standard in teacher certification
- National Board standards are created by <u>teachers for teachers</u>

National Board Standards - 5 Propositions

What teachers should know and be able to do.

- Teachers are committed to students and their learning
- Teachers know the subject they teach and how to teach those subjects to students
- Teachers are responsible for managing and monitoring student learning
- 4. Teachers think systematically about their practice and learn from experience
- 5. Teachers are members of learning communities

What is the National Board Process?

Collect standards-based evidence of accomplished practice of the Five Core Propositions through a series of four components.

Component 1: Content Knowledge (computer-based assessment)

Component 2: Differentiation in Instruction (classroom-based portfolio)

Component 3: Teaching Practice and Learning Environment (classroom-based portfolio with 2 video components)

Component 4: Effective and Reflective Practitioner (classroom based-portfolio)

Which certification is right for me?

16 different disciplines and multiple development levels

Am I eligible for the National Board Certification?

- All teachers must have completed 3 years of teaching
 - o Teachers must be certified for 3 years

Does the certification expire?

- Initial Certification = 5 years
- Maintenance of Certification = 5 years (Maintenance is required in your original certificated area)

How long will it take to get certified?

- Initial Certification
 - 5 years to complete
 - All components must be submitted in first 3 years
 - 2 years for retakes if needed
- Maintenance of Certification
 - Can start one year prior to expiration
 - Allows for a retake year before certification expires
 - If certification expires, you must start all over again like the initial certification
 - Only 2 components to complete in your original area of certification

How many components should I do a year?

- National Board for Professional Teaching Standards
 - Recommends 2 to 3 years
 - Components can be submitted in any order
 - People have completed all four components in one year
 - You can actually start a component (2, 3 or 4) after April 1

What does it cost?

- \$75 registration fee Candidates pay yearly when completing certification
- Initial Component Fees
 - \$475 per component
 - Fee waiver through MSDE/CCPS will cover all component fees
 - Teachers must meet deadline to be eligible
 - Teachers can pay the component fees on their own
 - Retakes will be paid once per component
- Maintenance of Certification
 - \$495
 - Fee waiver through MSDE/CCPS
 - Retake will be paid one time per MOC

Does an NBCT increase my salary?

- Currently (2022-23 and 2023-24 school years)
 - All National Board Certified Teachers receive a \$10,000 salary increase
- Career Ladder Implementation (starting 2025-26 school year)
 - o Teachers must teach at least 60% of the day
 - Definition: responsible for teaching students directly
 - o Based on different roles in the school system not all will be eligible for salary increase
 - Some who are currently receiving the increase will lose the increase once the career ladder is implemented
 - Additional salary increases for each renewal

Salary Increase starts the following fiscal year

- Scores are released in December
- Salary increase starts July 1 the following year

When do I need to decide for the fee incentive?

- Initial Candidate paperwork must be submitted by <u>September 20, 2024</u> to <u>Wesley Zimmerman</u>, Director of Education Services
- Register with the <u>National Board</u> and get a candidate ID number prior to submitting the MOU
- Candidates must complete a Notarized MOU
 - MOU holds the teacher accountable for the cost if the component(s) are not submitted
 - MOUs can be found in the Schoology course or on the <u>CCPS Website</u>
 - MOU only needs to be submitted at the beginning of the initial certification process
 - Maintenance of Certification and Retakes have a different MOU
- Candidates will submit information on the <u>2024-25 Submittal Form</u>
 - o Form must be submitted by September 20, 2024
