Flanders Field......Paul A. Aitken The text is written by a Canadian physician Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae. Flanders is the northern part of Belgium and the poppies that grow there have become a common symbol of WWI, especially in England on Remembrance Day. Sadako Sasaki was 2 years old when the atomic bomb landed on Hiroshima, Japan. When she was 11 she was diagnosed with Leukemia and given a year to live. There is a Japanese legend that if a person folds a thousand paper cranes their wish will come true. Sadako folded over 1000 paper cranes, but unfortunately she died in 1955. A statue in the Hiroshima Peace Park that honors Sadako reads "This is our cry. This is our prayer. Peace for the world."
