			Good morning, I'm a CCSD parent writing to ask that the Board please include the section stricken from the SCSBA recommended RESTRAINT, SECLUSION, AND INTENTIONAL PHYSICAL CONTACT policy that limits when restraint and seclusion can be used. South Carolina is one of only two states in the country (!!) that doesn't have a policy regarding restraint and seclusion. Children with special needs will be most affected by the elimination of this pivotal requirement by the Board of Trustees.
