CCSD BOARD OF TRUSTEES Board Meeting MINUTES

March 26, 2018 75 Calhoun Street, Charleston, SC 29401

A regular meeting of the Charleston County School District Board of Trustees was held on Monday, March 26, 2018, in the board room at 75 Calhoun Street.

The following board members were present: Mrs. Kate Darby, Chair; Rev. Eric Mack, Vice Chair; Mrs. Cindy Bohn Coats; Rev. Chris Collins; Mr. Todd Garrett; Mr. Kevin Hollinshead; Ms. Priscilla Jeffery; Mr. Michael Miller; Mr. Chris Staubes; and Dr. Gerrita Postlewait, Superintendent of Schools and Executive Secretary.

The news media was duly notified of the meeting, and representatives were present.

I. Call to Order

Mrs. Darby called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m. with five board members present (Darby, Garrett, Hollinshead, Jeffery, Staubes).

II. Adoption of Agenda/Approval of Consent Agenda Items

Motion was made by Mr. Staubes, seconded by Mr. Hollinshead, and unanimously carried to adopt the March 26, 2018 board agenda and approve the consent agenda items.

Motion was made by Mr. Hollinshead, seconded by Mr. Garrett, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes from the regular meeting on February 26, 2018, and the special-called meeting on March 12, 2018.

Motion was made by Mr. Hollinshead, seconded by Mr. Staubes, and unanimously carried to go into Executive Session for the purpose of considering the following agenda items:

IV. Open Session Reconvened

The board reconvened in Open Session at 5:30 p.m. with all members present. There was a moment of silence, and Garrett Academy of Technology JROTC presented colors for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Consideration of Executive Session Items:

A. Contractual Matters

1. <u>Charter School Facility Lease Agreements</u> (Acceleration Academy, PACE, and East Light Academy)

Motion was made by Mr. Garrett and seconded by Mrs. Coats to approve the three facility lease agreements for Acceleration Academy, PACE, and East Light Academy with changes implemented that were discussed in Executive Session. Motion carried 6-3 (Collins, Hollinshead, and Miller voted no).

2. District 20 Land Agreement

Motion was made by Mr. Garrett and seconded by Mr. Miller to direct staff to execute the District 20 land agreement. Motion carried 7-0-2 (Collins and Staubes abstained).

3. District 3 Lot Lease

Motion was made by Mr. Garrett and seconded by Mrs. Coats to disapprove the lot lease and approve the bus lot to be constructed at the James Island Elementary School property as first approved in 2014. There was considerable discussion. Staff informed the board that if a decision is not made now, the construction of Camp Road Middle School will be delayed. The money to lease another lot would have to come from GOF funds which would take away from paying for teachers and other instructional needs. In response to a question from the board, Mr. Borowy explained the difference in a bus depot and a bus lot. The District 3 site will be a bus lot which will include only minor maintenance, the same as is done at other bus lots in the county. Major bus maintenance occurs at the Azalea Drive bus depot in District 4. The motion carried 5-4 (Collins, Hollinshead, Mack, and Miller voted no).

B. Student Transfer Appeal

Motion was made by Mrs. Coats and seconded by Mr. Staubes to uphold the District 2 constituent board's decision regarding a student transfer appeal. Motion carried 8-1 (Hollinshead voted no).

C. Student Expulsion Appeal

Motion was made by Mrs. Coats and seconded by Rev. Mack to overturn the District 4 constituent board's decision and place the student at Daniel Jenkins Academy. Motion carried 9-0.

D. Student Placement Appeal

Motion was made by Mrs. Darby and seconded by Mrs. Jeffery to overturn the District 2 board decision and return the student to his home school on board probation for the remainder of the 2017-18 school year. Motion carried 9-0.
