Charleston, SC - Charleston County School District (CCSD) has opened enrollment to five-year-old students for kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year. Students who are going to be 5 by September 1, 2024. Registration is open for the remainder of the current school year and throughout the summer [online](#).

Students currently enrolled in four-year-old kindergarten programs in the district should register as returning students using the parent portal.

Parents will need the following documentation to complete the online registration form:

- The child's legal birth certificate
- A current South Carolina Certificate of Immunization, or a South Carolina Certificate of Medical or Religious Exemption
- A property tax receipt or a rental lease showing all occupants
- Two utility bills showing the correct home address

If the documentation is not currently available, please complete the registration form now. You will be able to upload the documents or deliver them to the school after the form is submitted.

Please note children who turn 4 by September 1, 2024, can only apply for a 4K program.
