**Charleston, SC** – Due to the potential flooding from Tropical Storm Nicole, Charleston County School District (CCSD) schools, programs, and offices located downtown on the peninsula of Charleston are moving to eLearning or remote work days tomorrow, Thursday, November 10, 2022. All CCSD buildings located in downtown Charleston will be closed.

Only afterschool programs in the downtown area of CCSD scheduled for Thursday, November 10, 2022, are canceled, including Kaleidoscope. Kaleidoscope programs not located on the peninsula will be open.
