What: Charleston County School District (CCSD) is hosting a community meeting to discuss the process to build a support building for ECHS on the Wilmot J. Fraser campus. CCSD Staff will present information about the needs of the ECHS academic program, share information about the current space, and how the space is used. There will be an opportunity for participants to provide written comments and to speak with CCSD staff directly.

Voters approved the Phase V Building plan in November 2020 as part of the CCSD Capital Programs one-cent sales tax extension, and the ECHS support building is in the first wave of projects.
