In addition to serving in the field of transportation and fleet management, Lynch served in law enforcement for over 20 years and has held positions in emergency planning and management.

Since 2017 has been the District Transportation Operations Manager. He was responsible for daily operational activities of the transportation service vendor, ensuring contract compliance and resolving evolving transportation issues.
