What: Representatives from Charleston County School District will be available at James Island Charter High School (JICHHS) in the evenings for the next few weeks to discuss the proposed District 3 Bus Lot.

No appointments are necessary; members of the community will be able to have conversations with individuals who are involved in the process. The proposed bus lot would create a capacity for 23 buses and will be located behind the football stadium on the existing practice field (there are currently 13 buses housed at JICHHS).
