School Board Brief

Exploring the renewal of our expiring operating levy

I first want to thank the voters again for helping us to pass an operational levy this past November. The approved operating levy was an additional levy to our existing operations levy that expires this year on June 30.

With the passage of the Education Omnibus bill last year, school boards across Minnesota now have the opportunity to renew an existing levy one time without needing to go to the taxpayers for approval (MN Statute 126C.17).

This benefits our district greatly by allowing our school board to hold a vote to continue an existing levy without needing to run a costly campaign. This saves the district and taxpayers tens of thousands of dollars. In the November 2023 elections, nearly 100% of levy renewals that went to voters passed.

The Board will be exploring this opportunity to review our expiring operating levy and continue it for another ten years. If the Board is interested in moving forward, there are requirements from the state to hear from the public on this topic prior to

making any final decisions. The Board will discuss this topic at the May 7 School Board regular meeting at the St. Anthony Community Center, 3301 Silver Lake Road at 7 p.m. If the Board wants to direct the district to continue at that point, a special board meeting and public forum will be held on May 21 prior to the work session. Action to approve the renewal of the levy needs to occur before June 15, so any potential passage will occur at the June 7 regular meeting.



February and March mark a busy period for Viviana, with the administration of the Access test, a standardized EL assessment that evaluates students' proficiency in English. 
