AB602 funds are distributed to member LEAs based on the district's most recently certified ADA for that year as a percent of the SELPAs total ADA. As voted/approved by our Governing Board, the SELPA administration adopted budget and Low Incidence (LI) funding are withheld off the top of AB602 allocations for SELPA operations and Itinerant services to districts respectively. Remaining amounts withheld and not spent by year-end are returned to the LEAs as a percent of their P2 ADA to the SELPA total.

One hundred percent (100%) of all Property Taxes is disbursed to the member LEAs and based on prior-year P2 ADA.

Federal IDEA dollars are directly passed through to the LEAs. Funds are distributed in the same manner in which they are earned. The SELPA does not hold any funds with the exception of ADR and Part C for Infants.
