Act 1 of 2006 Property Tax Relief

Where does the Index come from?

- Calculated by averaging the percentage increases in PA statewide average weekly wages and the Federal Employment Cost Index for elementary and secondary schools
- ECI/SAWW = Employment Cost Index/Statewide Average Weekly Wages

What's the Purpose?

- Intended to limit tax increases to a cost of living index
- 2012-13 base index is 1.7%,
 NWL is adjusted to 2.0%
 based on the District's wealth
- 1.01 mill increase, or \$438,000
- Board adopted a resolution to stay under index 12/14/11, which means the max tax increase for 2012-13 can be 1.01 mills, or \$438,000

Revenues- \$35,945,144

68.7% - Local

28.0% - State

0.6% - Federal





2.7% - Use Of **Fund Balance** (Savings)

Revenue Dynamics-What affects revenues?

- Real Estate
 - Assessed value adjustments
 - Continued slow growth
- Earned Income Taxes
 - Starting to see increased EIT
- Real Estate Transfer taxes
 - Reduction in sales price & volume

- Interest income
 - Stable interest rates
- State Revenue
 - State budget deficit
 - State subsidy reductions
 - Student Achievement Education Block Grant
- Donations/Contributions
 - Foundation (EITC funds)
- Federal Stimulus
 - Eliminated in 2011-12

Lehigh County Reassessment

- What is Reassessment?
 - Redistribution of current tax dollars (County, Municipal, & School) to correct inequities caused by years of unequal market value changes
- Who does it affect?
 - All properties in Lehigh County
- When does it go into effect?
 - January 1, 2013 (2013-14 school taxes)

- How does it affect NWL?
 - Revenue Neutral
 - District re-sets the millage rate to equal the same \$
 - o = \$0 increase
- How does it affect NWL residents?
 - Heidelberg 71.7% ¹
 - o Lowhill 40.5% 🕇
 - Lynn 71.3% 1
 - Weisenberg 46.8%
 - o = \$ increase/decrease

Student Achievement Education Block Grant

- Combines current line items into one block grant
 - Basic Education
 - Transportation/Non-Public Transportation
 - Social Security
- Estimated Increase \$78,715
 - 12-13 \$6,924,497
 - 11-12 \$6,845,782



Salaries & Benefits

- Meetings with Administrators to develop staffing plans for 12-13
- Goal- Maintain staffing levels districtwide to meet the needs of the educational programs
- Next Week- discuss staffing plan with board

Staffing 2009-10 to Present

- Administration
 - Elimination of 3 positions
- Teachers
 - Elimination of 18 positions
- Support
 - Secretarial
 - Elimination of 2 positions
 - Savings on 2 benefited positions
 - Custodial
 - Elimination of 3 positions through retirements (Weisenberg Outsourcing)
 - Savings on 4 benefited positions

28 STAFF ELIMINATED!

Annual Savings

(projected for 2012-13)

- Administration \$215,000
- Teachers \$1,773,000
- Secretarial \$139,000
- Custodians \$84,000 (net of out-sourcing costs)

Total Annual Savings \$2,211,000

Equivalent of 5 mills

Redefining the Budget Process

- Develop educational goals and build budget to support
- Budget strategies to maximize dollars and minimize risk
- Long-term strategies to help minimize economic difficulties
