Farmington Central High School (FCHS) serves students, ages 16-19, in a small setting while meeting the Farmington Public Schools' benchmarks and all common core academic requirements. Face-to-face classes offered are: English, math, social studies, science, business/CTE, and art. In addition, opportunities are available for new credit (On-Demand) and credit recovery utilizing an online learning environment (E20/20) based on schedule flexibility. FCHS provides a smaller learning environment where we focus on teaching, mentoring, and promoting understanding and leadership. Through continued collaboration among students, parents, and teachers, our goal is to increase the rate of students remaining in school and graduating with a high school diploma.

FCHS has partnerships with MiWorks! and [NAF Career Academy](#), which offers NAFTrack Certification for students completing a series of career-focused courses. The goal is for students to grow both academically and socially, and to leave school with a plan on how they are going to get to their next step in life. Students are offered programs at the Oakland Technical Campus to help guide them towards their future career success, or Dual Enrollment opportunities through Oakland Community College or Schoolcraft Community College to help prepare for their post-secondary transition.

Farmington Central High School students earn (18) or more graduation credits and report to school Monday-Friday from 7:50 a.m. - 2:50 p.m. Shuttle transportation to and from student's *home school* is provided by the District.
