A way she found solace and comfort was through food, both American and eventually her native Vietnamese cuisine. Through iconic foods and staple dishes, Nguyen chronicles her journey to acceptance and discovery of her own unique identity.

As a Vietnamese girl coming of age in Grand Rapids, Michigan, Bich (Bit) Nguyen is filled with a rapacious hunger for American identity. In the pre-PC era Midwest, where the devoutly Christian blond-haired, blue-eyed Jennifers and Tiffanys reign supreme, Nguyen's barely conscious desire to belong transmutes into a passion for American food. More exotic seeming than her Buddhist grandmother's traditional specialties: spring rolls, delicate pancakes stuffed with meats, and fried shrimp cakes. The campy, preservative-filled delicacies of mainstream America capture her imagination. And, in this remarkable book, the glossy branded allure of such American foods as Pringles, Kit Kats, and Toll House cookies become an ingenious metaphor for her struggle to fit in, to become a real American. The Assignment

I will provide an example that you may use for inspiration/guidance.

The portion that must be completed **before** school starts is the following: You will create your own family cookbook filled with recipes, photos, and anecdotes. The best medium for this will be Canva or another similar design site. You may need to make an account, but a basic membership is free (with restrictions). You do not need to print and bind your cookbook together, it will be submitted digitally.

Your cookbook must contain the following:

- Cover page "Stealing ___(your name)____'s Dinner"
- Table of Contents
- About the author page (a picture of you with your background info)
- Favorite Snacks page (with little blurbs about the positive memories connected with them)
- 7 recipe pages complete with a photo, anecdote that correlates with the dish, and the actual recipe
- Last page- personal connection to how the food of your life/ family/ culture has influenced your personal growth

Please note that the project is not the only assignment that we will be doing over the summer reading. Once school is back in session, there will be several graded assignments over the memoir that will test your recall of the reading, clarity of concepts, and comprehension. It is expected that you will invest the appropriate amount of time and effort into the summer reading so that you can continue to be successful once the fall semester begins.
