# INSTRUCTIONAL COACH BRIGHT SPOTS

- <u>Kindergarten Registration</u>: Our school district held the annual kindergarten registration on
   April 9th. Our Kindergarten teachers, office staff, and community organizations from each of
   our elementary schools work collaboratively to hold this annual event. Shadow Butte
   Elementary screened 47 upcoming Kindergarteners.
- Spring ISAT: 3rd 5th grade ISAT tests are underway! Each spring, students across Idaho participate in the Idaho Standards Achievement Tests in English Language Arts/Literacy, Mathematics, and Science. These tests take place over a two week period and provide insight into individual student performance levels, as well as grade level areas of strength and weakness for our schools and district.
- SMART Training and Regional Conference: This year our Kindergarten Teaching Team and
  myself have participated in in the SMART (Striving to Meet Achievement in Reading Together)
  project. This is a multi-year training for K-3 educators that strives to advance teacher
  knowledge of the science of reading and apply within everyday instruction and intervention.
  Next year we are expanding this project into our 1st and 2nd grades as well. We attended the
  annual conference this month.


# AREAS TO GROW IN

### **End of Year Testing:**

- 1. **ISAT:** Grades 3-5 will be assessed in English Language Arts, Math, and Science (for 5th grade). Testing will take place from April 22nd to May 8th.
- 2. **ISIP Reading:** This assessment focuses on early reading skills, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension, and is administered to students in grades K-3. Testing will be May 8th May 16th.
- 3. **ISTATION Math:** Covering a range of math concepts from number sense to algebraic thinking, this test is for students in grades K-5. Testing is scheduled from May 8th to May 16th.
