Amy and I have shared some life together. Our jobs have changed quite a bit in the past seven years, but our lives have also changed. Amy wrote last week about how she marks time in moments rather than years. I am blessed to have shared some of those life moments with her as marriages have formed, people close to us have passed, dogs have come and gone, grandchildren have been born, colleagues have left, colleagues have come back, children have moved away, children have come back, and throughout, we have laughed as we expressed our gratitude for the chance to live this Blessed life at St. Francis.

Amy is leaving St. Francis in a better place, and I am fortunate to build on her work as I have the privilege of serving the school as the incoming Assistant Head of School. She has built a culture of trust and authenticity in the administration. Amy is a leader who leads from the middle, improving things for those above and below.
