Activities: This, too, should be reviewed by your college counselor.

- There are 10 spaces available but you do not need to fill them all in! Colleges value depth over breadth.
- List activities in order of most significant to least, including greatest leadership.
- Be careful that the hours you list make sense and add up.
- Be sure to include activities (including work) from outside of school.
- This is your resume—spend some time on it.

Writing: One of the most important parts of your application.

- Write, re-write, re-write, and re-write some more. Be careful of too many editors—your essay needs to speak for you.
- Supplements: Invest as much time, energy, and thought into these as your main essay. At some colleges/universities, the supplemental essays carry more weight than the Common Application essay. Be careful to follow directions.

Additional Information: Use this space only to explain anything that has affected your path through high school, such as previous school transcript issues, COVID, repetition of grade, summer courses, medical leaves, classes incomplete or failed, honor or disciplinary code violations that resulted in probation, etc. You can also include a brief summary of your Capstone or Independent Study project. Basically, explain anything that needs to be explained.

DO complete the Arts Supplement if you have materials and interest.

Do NOT use the Athletic Supplement
