

Georgia O'Keefe was born on a farm in Wisconsin. Once she grew older, she began trying abstract painting. She took things from nature, such as clouds or waves, and began to paint them as abstract shapes. A gallery owner displayed her drawings. A few years later, she painted skyscrapers. She also painted detailed close-ups of flowers. In many of her pieces, the scale of the flower is so large that it almost appears abstract. In the 1930s, She also began painting desert landscapes in New Mexico.

She painted until she passed away at the age of 98.




## The Easter Miracle


