Students have the flexibility to engage with both their ongoing class subjects and materials, as well as catch up on previous class subjects and/or materials within the Virtual Academy. Additionally, students can concurrently enroll at St. Helens High School and the Virtual Academy, allowing them to participate in specific in-person courses, often focusing on Career Technical Education (CTE) fields such as Woods, Metals, Autoshop, and more.

This program is well-suited for self-motivated and self-directed students who excel in independent learning. It also caters to students who are balancing full-time work commitments and require a flexible schedule. Additionally, the program accommodates students who have diverse reasons for needing distance learning.

As the district's options high school, all resident students in grades K-12 are eligible to enroll in accordance with Oregon law.
