All Four Comprehensive Campuses Receives Top Rankings in U.S. News & World Report

Hacienda La Puente Unified School District is home to four comprehensive high schools, each offering a distinctive mix of programs and resources to support every student on their path to success. These schools ranked in the top 32% in the U.S. News & World Report's 2024 Best High Schools rankings. In partnership with global research firm RTI International. U.S. News evaluated approximately 25,000 public high schools and ranked 17,660 across the United States. Top performers were selected by weighted scores across six indicators of school quality, placing all four schools in the top 32% of the nation. Additionally, Glen A. Wilson ranked among the top 5% of all high schools in California for the second consecutive year.



"We are incredibly proud of all our high schools and their commitment to student success," Hacienda La Puente Unified Director of High Schools Dr. Mark Anderson said. "These rankings underscore the hard work and dedication of our students, educators, staff, and school communities and highlight our commitment to providing vibrant programs and resources to ensure college and career readiness." In addition to the high school recognitions, nine Hacienda La Puente Unified elementary and four middle schools scored in the top 28% of schools in the state based on the U.S. News & World Report's best elementary and middle school rankings, released in November 2023.

La Puente High School Students Enhance District Safety through Community Emergency Response Training

La Puente High School students and staff strengthened their dedication to real-world civic action by participating in the National Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) program, a hybrid course developed to educate and train individuals in disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their school, household, and District community. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) sponsored program was set in motion by the school's Public Safety Career Technical Education (CTE) pathway instructor Antonia Ramirez. After extensive research, Ramirez introduced 29 CTE students and six staff members, including Principal Dr. Lisa Lopez, to the hybrid CERT program – a nine-unit online course packed with rigorous curriculum provided by the University of Utah, and completed with a hands-on practical portion led by the Los Angeles County Fire Department (LACFD) on April 13. "I was so nervous about doing the in-person CERT training, but it was actually a lot of fun and very informative," Public Safety pathway sophomore Ruby Ornelas said. "I was tasked with doing treatment and triage during the simulations and I felt so empowered knowing that these skills would help me benefit my community in the event of an emergency. On top of earning this certificate, the Public Safety pathway offers other certifications and pieces of training to help us excel in our careers, and for that, I am so grateful."


