As we move toward the final months of the school year, the district enters into a very busy time. Budget development continues to move forward and we continue to gather further information in terms of anticipated revenue from both the state and federal level. In addition, students are progressing forward in their studies during challenging times and the West Canada Valley Class of 2021 is entering the final months of their senior year. As we look ahead, the district plans to hold commencement outdoors on the football field as we did last year. Commencement is scheduled for June 26, 2021. As we get closer, the district will communicate the details to everyone.

Budget Season

The district has devoted a great deal of time and effort building our budget for the 2021-2022 school year. The governor's proposed budget has provided West Canada Valley with a slight increase in operating aid in comparison to the previous year. With much of our revenue dependent on state aid, the district will watch closely as future discussions occur at both the state and federal level. As always, we will work diligently to provide a program that is high quality for our students and responsible to the taxpayers. We look forward to your support throughout this process.

Regents Exams/State Assessments

As we continue to promote strong foundation skills in our young students the district recognizes that our curriculum/assessment practices are an important piece of student development. The district has continued to work diligently on curriculum development as well as our instructional strategies during the past year. This will continue to be a high priority as we move forward. This year's state assessments including Regents exams are still under discussion at both the federal and state level. Districts across the state are expecting guidance this month on the requirements and the proposed testing schedules. We continue to work through the pandemic and understand our teachers and students continue to face unusual circumstances. Once we know what tests are being made available and the schedule; we will certainly communicate to all stakeholders.

BOARD OF EDUCATION NEWS

BOARD OF EDUCATION THREE OPEN SEATS

Three (3) Board of Education Seats are open, two are three-year terms and one is a two-year term. Petitions are available in the District Office for candidates interested in running for a seat on the School Board. Qualified district residents will be electing three (3) members to the Board of Education on Tuesday, May 18, 2021. Mr. Carson Marko and Ms. Janine Lynch's terms expire on June 30, 2021. The remaining vacant seat is a two-year term that will expire on June 30, 2023.

To qualify for membership on a school board an individual:

- Must be able to read and write
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before the election
- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family
- May not be a current employee of the school
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office

Candidate's petitions must be returned to the District Clerk no later than April 19, 2021 and must contain a minimum of 25 qualified voters' signatures. FROM THE NURSES' OFFICE

PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS

New York State Law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering Pre-K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th grade. Physicals are acceptable that have been performed no longer than 12 months prior to the 1st day of school in September. If your child has an upcoming appointment for their physical exam please notify the health office. If your child has had a recent physical exam please provide the health office with a copy. At this time in school physical exams are not being offered.

Mandatory physical examinations are required for all students regardless if they are learning remotely or inperson this school year.

ABSENCE

Please contact the health office if your child is going to be absent from school for any reason.

1. Have a new phone number? Please contact the school so we can update our files. In the event of an emergency situation current phone numbers are very important.


2. Please make sure someone is home for elementary students when the bus arrives in the afternoon.

NEW YORK STATE BAND DIRECTORS ASSOCIATION (NYSBDA) HONORS BANDS

The NYSBDA Honors Bands consist of students from all over New York State and acceptance is based on the score that a student receives at the New York State School Music Association Solo Festival (NYSSMA) the previous year.

Each year hundreds of students participate in NYSSMA Solo Festival with the hope of achieving a perfect score that will secure their way into one of the Conference All-State Ensembles. The NYSBDA High School Honors Concert Band was formed with the sole interest of taking the students who have scored a 98, 99, or 100 on their Level VI solo, but did not make into Conference All-State. Two students from West Canada Valley were chosen for this honor. **MADILYN CONNOR** (junior) was selected to perform on the flute. Madilyn received a 99 on a Level VI solo, this is a college level solo and in addition was chosen for a solo in the performance. **LYDIA REIMER** (junior) was selected to perform on clarinet. Lydia received a 95 on her Level VI solo, again a college level solo. Madilyn and Lydia study with Mrs. Bonney.

With COVID-19 protocols in place the NYSBDA Bands were completely virtual this year. Lydia and Madilyn attended weekly rehearsals on Zoom and then were asked to record themselves playing through difficult literature and submit it to the conference chair. The videos/recordings of the students involved throughout the state were then compiled by an Audio/Visual tech and were featured in a NYSBDA concert blasted out to those involved on March 6th. It was a spectacular performance, congratulations Lydia and Madilyn!
