

CLASS OF 2020 GRADUATION

West Canada Valley has come up with two viable plans for graduation. Regardless of the plan chosen, the school plans on holding the graduation ceremony on Saturday, June 27, 2020.

Plan A is a small ceremony held over a period of eight to ten hours, where each student would receive an assigned time to come into school, walk across the stage, receive their diploma and awards, have their picture taken, and be allowed to have four family members as guests. This plan would allow for a small gathering of ten (10) people or less and would require individuals to wear masks and socially distance. Under this plan, only those with tickets and the graduate would be allowed on school property and only within a window of time during their assigned time.

Plan B would consist of a virtual graduation consisting of pre-recorded speeches embedded into an online presentation consisting of pictures of students in their caps and gowns and the announcement of each graduate's accolades. Under this plan, Superintendent Shepardson, Board of Education President Mr. Gage, and MS/HS Principal Mr. Broadbent would be personally delivering diplomas to all of the graduates at home.

Ultimately, the decision will be based on what the school district is allowed to do under state and local guidance. A final decision regarding graduation ceremonies will be announced on Monday, June 15th.

ATHLETICS UPDATES

We hope that everyone is safe and well during these turbulent times. WCV is saddened to have cancelled the spring sports season amid the COVID-19 pandemic. We would like to take this opportunity to wish our senior athletes the best of luck in all their future endeavors. It has been an honor and a privilege to watch you all mature throughout your various athletic careers. In a pandemic shortened school year consisting of just the fall and winter sports season, this year's senior class helped guide West Canada to League Championships in Boys Soccer, Girls Varsity Basketball, Girls Varsity Indoor Track, Boys Varsity Indoor Track, and our 8-man Football team competed in the Sectional Final at the Carrier Dome. WCV won Sectional Titles in Boys Varsity Indoor Track, Fall Cheerleading and Winter Cheerleading. The Competitive Winter Cheer team proudly represented West Canada Valley at the NYSPHSAA State Championship Competition at Rochester Institute of Technology. To go along with all of these accolades, our WCV Boys Varsity Basketball team competed in the Sectional Semi-final game at Onondaga Community College, and both boys and girls JV basketball teams were league champions this winter. Congratulations, to the seniors, underclassmen, coaches and all of the parents for their dedicated hard work that made the shortened 2019-2020 athletic year such a wild success.

Unfortunately, due to State of New York gathering restrictions, this year's Varsity Sports Banquet will not be allowed to take place in its traditional format. In the days leading up to graduation (June 27th), WCV will present each varsity team's athletic accomplishments for the season. Each team's athletic award winners will be recognized as well. This information will be posted on the school website and social media account. All senior athletic awards will be recognized during senior graduation.

The status of fall sports is still much unknown. WCV will plan on sports as normal until we receive different guidance from the state level. Fall schedules are completed and can be viewed on SchedulGalaxy.com. The official start date for fall varsity sports is August 19th. Modified sports start on August 26th. Should anything change, this information will be posted on the school website and the fall coaches will reach out to their players.

NYSED guidance on sports physicals for Fall of 2020: Permit student athletes to participate in the fall 2020 sports season if they have previously had a health examination for school attendance in the 2018-2019 or 2019-2020 school years and provide a health history completed and signed by the parent/guardian within 30 days of the start of the season. Student athletes who have not previously had a health examination must still obtain a health examination prior to participation in the fall 2020 sports season. At this time, students should plan to obtain the required health examination prior to participation in the winter or spring 2020-21 seasons, although that may change depending on the status of COVID-19 in the fall. The Department will provide updated information as needed.

ALUMNI HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

West Canada Valley would like to acknowledge five former student athletes who have been named to their respective College Halls of Fame. Banners for these storied Indian alumni will be displayed in the high school gymnasium.

Melissa Hartman-Snyder - One of the most prolific players in the history of women's basketball at St. John Fisher College, Melissa Hartman Snyder excelled in nearly every facet of the game. The 2006 Empire 8 Conference Player of the Year, Hartman, led the Cardinals to one of the most seasons in program history as a senior. Hartman led the Empire 8 in scoring with 20 points per game, 9.4 rebounds and 3.6 steals per game, as the Cardinals posted a 25–3 overall record and undefeated season in Empire 8 Conference play, the first program in Empire 8 history to accomplish that feat. A starter in 86 of a possible 87 games over her final two seasons, Hartman tallied 10 doubles in her senior year, including a 42-point performance where she shot 16-for-16 from the foul line, to tie the College's single-game scoring record and a




36-point, 20-rebound performance in a win over Nazareth. Hartman ranked among the top 20 in all of NCAA Division III in scoring, steals and free throw shooting, while her 558 points, 262 rebounds, 100 steals and 86.1% free throw percentage all rank in the top 10 on the College single-season list. At the time of graduation, Hartman ranked third at Fisher in career steals with 290, six in field goals made with 519 and sixth in total points with 1,338. An All-East Region First Team selection and finalist for the Rochester Area College's Female Athlete of the Year, Hartman helped lead the Cardinals to a 98-15 record over her four-year career, including three straight 25-win seasons in her final two years. Fisher won the Empire 8 title in her freshman and senior seasons, while claiming ECAC titles in her sophomore and junior seasons. An academic All-American her senior year, Melissa graduated from Fisher with a double-major in Childhood Education and Special Education.

WCV ATHLETICS NEWS

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ALUMNI HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Jared Suderley - '14 is the most prolific scorer and rebounder in the history of Hartwick men's basketball. He is the only player at 'Wick to amass 2,000 points (2,034) and 900 rebounds (920). Suderley was named an All-American by a pair of organizations in both his sophomore and senior seasons while helping the Hawks to 70 wins, three NCAA Tournaments, and two Empire 8 Championships in his four campaigns. In his first season, Suderley was tapped the D3hoops.com All-East Region, the ECAC Upstate, and the Empire 8 Rookie of the Year. He was named the Empire 8 Player



of the Year in his sophomore campaign while garnering D3hoops.com and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) all-region, ECAC Upstate, and Empire 8 First Team honors. He helped the Hawks to their second straight NCAA Tournament appearance and a tie for a College-record 23 victories. At the close of the season both D3hoops.com and the NABC selected him to their All-America Second Team. He returned the Hawks to the national tournament with an Empire 8 title in his senior season with repeat awards for Empire 8 Player of the Year and first team honors, as well as D3hoops.com All-East Region First Team, NABC East Region First Team, and ECAC Upstate First Team honors. He added an E8 Tournament MVP, was invited to the Reese's Division III All-Star Game, and was a finalist for the Josten's Trophy, given to the best player in the nation. He landed on the D3hoops.com All-America First Team and the NABC All-America Third Team to close out his storied career.

Theresa Lindsay Synakowski -Theresa led all SUNYAC catchers in hitting (.462 BA) in 1997 while propelling the softball squad to their most wins (11) in a season and followed that performance by boosting the Wildcats to their best record ever (13-11) in 1998. She was named All-ECAC that season after batting .516 as a senior. Theresa is SUNYIT's career leader in slugging percentage (.703), runs batted in (55) and doubles (19), is tied for home runs (5) and is second in career batting average (.469) and total bases (102). A native of Poland, New York, Theresa majored in Business/Public



Management, graduating in 1998. She joined the Wildcat coaching staff in 2001 and took over the softball program as head coach in 2004. Theresa was inducted September 24, 2005.



ALUMNI HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Cindy Kemler - Newport, NY, is being inducted for her contributions as a student-athlete. Kemler led the Generals to their first two regional championships in women's basketball in 1979 and 1980. She was the first woman from New York State to be named National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Basketball All-American (1980). She averaged 18.3 points per game and 15 rebounds per game at the national tournament and was named to the All-Tournament team. She is a former West Canada Valley high school standout and is employed by Herkimer Elementary School. Kemler is also a well-respected basketball and soccer official for Section III.



Sue Wallace-Eaton - Eaton excelled on the hardwood for the Wildcats during a time when the College's athletes had only two years to call Cazenovia home. From 1993-95, Eaton took advantage to show what she had by scoring an impressive 1,241 points in just two seasons. She was named All-America by the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) after the 1993-94 season in which she led the nation in scoring with 25.9 points per game. Eaton captained the Wildcats for both of her seasons and finished with 335 career rebounds and 177 career assists. Also a member of the Wildcats softball team, Eaton went on to Division I Niagara University on a softball scholarship following her years at Cazenovia.

FROM THE NURSES' OFFICES

PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS

New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering Pre-K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th grade. A copy of the health examination must be provided to the school within 30 days from the start of school. Physicals are acceptable that have been performed no longer than 12 months prior to the 1st day of school in September. If your child has an appointment for an exam during the school year that is after the first 30 days of school, please notify the Health Office with that date. If a student has a physical exam at any grade level it is always helpful to provide the Health Office with a copy. If you have any questions please feel free to contact either:


