Every school day starts with the State, County, Township and Village highway departments making sure the roads are safe to travel on. They do an excellent job and are always there if our buses need extra help. Thank them for the great job they do.

The community support every year for the bus purchases is another important asset we have at West Canada. Our buses are the safest and most modern in the area. Thank you for the support.

The mechanics that maintain our bus fleet, they have obtained another year of success from New York State Department of Transportation for bus inspection. Each bus is inspected by a NY DOT inspector twice a year. Thank Shane Korniat and Eric Morse, our two mechanics, when you see them.

The bus drivers and monitors that are operating your children's bus are probably the most important ingredient of all to the "safe and sound" ride your children deserve. It is their personal judgment and skills that will ultimately assure your children ride the bus in a "safe and sound" manner every day. Thank them when you see them.

A big thank you from me to all the parents that make sure their children are loading and unloading safely and behaving on the bus so that a safe bus ride can be assured for all.



Herbert Fountain: King of the Science Fairs?

Herbert Fountain is well known for his innovative Science Fair projects. This year he developed a method for extending the life of organic-based solar cells. At the Binghamton Science Fair he won 8 awards for his designs.

At the April Utica College Regional Fair he won overall Grand Champion, a few hundred dollars in prizes, 10 specific awards and a 2 year Utica College Scholarship. Plus a pass to the next level of contests.

Herbert and two family members have just returned from an all expenses paid trip to Los Angeles, where he was a contestant in the INTEL International Science and Engineering Fair. Only 5 students from NY were selected to be included in the 1,778 students who represented 78 countries and territories around the globe. After a week of rubbing shoulders with Nobel laureate, writers, journal editors, and famous personalities, Herbert returned to state this had been the best week of his life. Asked why he reported this was the first time he had ever found a place where everybody actually knew what he was talking about all the time. That's Herbert. Only 10th grade and already wondering what he can do to top this next year!

Technology Class Work

This and other groups of students from WCV Technology classes have worked hard at producing some beautiful products. Just a few of them include what are seen in the pictures here. In these class we teach as many aspects as possible from an idea to finish products.
