Executive Board Governance and Operations

Consultants to the Executive Board

In order to pursue its educational mission and also to protect the public's financial investment in the District, the Executive Board will from time to time engage the services of qualified professional consultants. The kinds of assistance sought from consultants may include, but will not necessarily be limited to: (1) conducting fact-finding studies, surveys, and research; (2) provide counsel or services requiring special expertise; and (3) assisting the Executive Board in developing policy and program recommendations.

Before engaging any consultant, the Executive Board will require submission of a written proposal which can be incorporated into a contract or purchase order if it satisfies the wishes of the Executive Board. Proposals will detail: (1) the specific objectives to be accomplished by the consultant; (2) the specific tasks to be performed; (3) the procedures to be used in carrying out the tasks; (4) the target dates for the completion of tasks; and (5) the method to be used to report results to the Executive Board and/or to deliver any "product" (e.g., long-range plan, codified policy manual, etc.) to the Executive Board.
