Preparing for School

- Separate from your child so they get used to being away from you.
- Work on independence in the bathroom.
 Students should be able to vocalize when they need to go and should be independent in the bat



need to go and should be independent in the bathroom. This includes wiping.

- Practice following through with 1-2 step directions independently.
- Work on having patience and waiting. Students should be able to wait without interrupting for the length of a book or a conversation between adults.
- Build up your child's stamina over the summer. Work towards 10 minutes of uninterrupted reading or conversation. Limit Screen Time.



Preparing for School

- Practice being flexible... they should work on how to handle the disappointment if they aren't first, didn't win, or didn't get what they want.
- Teach your child to struggle a little bit.
- Start to phase out nap time. Students will have breaks throughout the day but will not have a nap time.
- Practice helping your child to express themselves and their feelings so they can independently do it at school.

Notes from the Main Office

Absences:

- All student absences must be reported to school.
- Absence Line: 781-293-5411
- Automatic Absence Call even if you have already called

Dropping off Students:

- Students may not be dropped off at school before 8:07.
- Doors open at 8:07 for students to enter the building.
- All students not in their homeroom by 8:20 are considered tardy.



Transportation:

Bus passes are free to all students at the elementary level. Please be advised that:

- 1. A student may only ride their assigned bus home.
- 2. Students are not permitted to ride alternate buses for playdates.
- 3. All kindergarten students must be met at the bus stop by an adult.
- 4. Children will be returned to school should an adult not be present. If also a North bus, then your child will be returned to North Pembroke Elementary School and not Bryantville.



Notes from the Main Office

Parent Pickup:

- Pick Up Patrol You will have an account to note any change in dismissal.
- Parent pick up students are called for dismissal at approximately 2:45 each day. Students must have a note stating that they are going to parent pick up.
- Early pick up must be done by 2:00.
- If you send a family member or neighbor to pick up your child, they must have an I.D. with them and you must notify the office of the change to dismissal prior to the child being picked up.

<u>Daycare:</u>

- If you have signed your child up for the afterschool program run by the YMCA or the Rec Center, please make sure you complete the dismissal form enclosed with teacher placement letter mailed in August.
- Your child will then be dismissed to the program at the end of the day.

Notes from Nurse Phillips



Communication:

- o Make your child's health concern(s) known to me.
- o Introduce yourself and your child.
- o Bring current signed healthcare provider orders.
- o All medication must be hand delivered by an adult.

Documentation of Immunizations and Physical Exams:

- o Please provide a copy of your child's <u>most recent</u> <u>physical exam</u>.
- o If warranted, provide an annual immunization exemption letter. *Please note, without proper documentation your child will not be allowed to enter school.

Food Allergies/Outside Food:

- We follow a "no sharing, no trading" model.
- If a class has a student with a nut allergy, the teacher will make parents/guardians aware to NOT send in nut containing snacks to be eaten in the classroom.
- Nuts and nut products MAY be consumed in the cafeteria to be eaten at the classroom tables
- Those students with nut allergies may choose to eat at the "nut free table" in the cafeteria.


How Do I Participate in the School?
