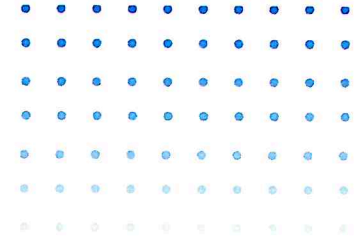

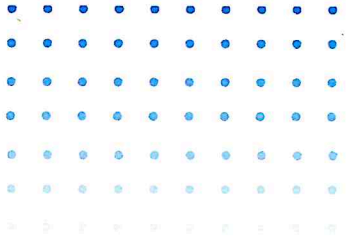
April

- Held our Annual Chapter Banquet where numerous awards were given out and new officers were inducted





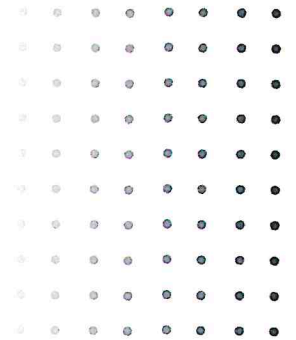
Holden Trap Shooting Team
