The International Baccalaureate (IB) Continuum







The IBCP is a **flexible** framework of international education that incorporates the values of the IB into a **unique** programme addressing the **personalised** needs of students engaged in **career-related** education

- academically rigorous and leads to further/higher education
- interdisciplinary approach to learning
- student-centered learning




What is the BTEC?

Developed by Pearson, BTECs are high-quality, career-focused qualifications grounded in the real world of work.

Pearson has developed the content of the new BTEC International Level 3 qualifications in collaboration with employers and representatives from higher education, and relevant professional bodies.

This means BTEC learners develop and apply the knowledge, skills and behaviours that employers and universities are looking for.








BTEC qualifications encompass **applied learning** that brings together knowledge and understanding with practical and technical skills. This applied learning is achieved through learners performing vocational tasks that encourage the development of appropriate vocational behaviours and transferable skills.

Transferable skills are those such as **communication**, **teamwork** and **research and analysis**, which are valued in both higher education and the workplace.

The approach provides **rigour** and **balance**, and promotes the ability to apply learning immediately in new contexts.

Why Introduce the BTEC?

- More options for students as we grow as a school
- Opportunity to develop industry related skills in entrepreneurship
- A pathway to study at university in the UAE

The MOE have set out equivalency requirements for studying at university in the UAE

CP + BTEC is eligible, and the course studied at university must be related to the BTEC component

Ministerial Decree 41 (2023) sets out the specific requirements







Qualifications

Pearson have developed BTEC courses in a range of sectors, with qualifications at varying levels:

The level and type of qualification determine the content, depth, and learning hours required from students to engage in and complete the BTEC.

Size and Structure - 510 Guided Learning Hours (GLH)

(Equivalent in size to 2 DP Courses or 1.5 International A Level)

Mandatory units

There are four mandatory units, two internal units and two set assignment units. Learners must complete and achieve a Pass or above in all mandatory units

Optional units

Esol Education school



Learners must complete optional units totalling at least 120 GLH.

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Details of the BTEC Course at Fairgreen

Assessment:

Assessment is designed to fit the purpose and objective of the qualification. It includes a range of assessment types and styles suited to vocational qualifications in the sector. All assessment is internal. Some mandatory units are assessed using Pearson Set Assignments.







Example Assessment - Assignment Brief
