



Budget Highlights

The 2024-25 Budget increases direct services to students:

- NY Next Generation Learning Standards
 - Advancing standards-aligned and data-supported curriculum, instruction & assessment
- Innovative & Engaging Learning Experiences
 - Progressing project-based learning, engineering & design, robotics and college/career readiness. Expands Career-Connections learning initiative and Work Place Learning internship program.
- Social-Emotional Learning
 - Empowering students to achieve their highest potential through evidence-based programs and support.
- Enhance Community Connections
 - Building strong student, family and community connection through multiple platforms.
- Facility Upgrades Strengthening Safety & Security
 - Partnering with law enforcement and safety professionals to identify and improve our facilities and operations.



Proposition 2 – Safety Capital Project

PROPOSITION 2: SCHOOL SAFETY CAPITAL PROJECT

Authorization of the Chester Union Free School District to implement a school district safety improvement program consisting of door and transactional area construction at Chester Elementary School, construction of transactional area at Chester Academy and district-wide security upgrades, other



improvements and related expenses at a total maximum cost of \$1,867,000, and to levy the necessary tax. The costs of the project and the related borrowing costs are eligible for New York State Building Aid at 67.7%. An average home in Chester would pay \$16.50 per year for 15 years.



Proposition 3 – Transfer of Maple Ave Building to Orange County

PROPOSITION 3: TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF MAPLE AVENUE BUILDING TO ORANGE COUNTY



Authorization of the Chester Union Free School District to transfer ownership and operation of the Maple Avenue building property to Orange County. The District would maintain ownership and use of the 1965 gym and athletic fields. This transfer would be made at no expense to Chester school district taxpayers.
