CONGRATULATIONS to Bedford High School for receiving the Ohio Department of Education MOMENTUM AWARD! The momentum award is for districts and buildings that have demonstrated outstanding improvement in achievement while also continuing to show growth. The momentum award is for districts and buildings that have improved their performance index by 3 or more points from the 2021-2022 report card to the 2022-2023 report card AND received a value-added progress rating of 4 or more stars.

Central & Glendale Primary School are Five Star Gold Rated Schools

On April 21, 2024, the State of Ohio awarded Central Primary School a Five-Star Rating for meeting the quality standards established by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and the Ohio Department of Education. At this time, Step Up to Quality is a Five-Star, Tiered Quality Training and Improvement System, however starting July 7, 2024, the tiers will transition to Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Both Glendale and Central Primary will be recognized under the new system as Gold-Rated Programs.

Academic Achievement in Bearcat Country makes us ROAR with Pride!

The Bedford City School District was highlighted as showing growth with regard to the Overall Rating Distribution (Comparison) of all Ohio Buildings. Central Primary, Bedford High School, Columbus Intermediate and Heskett Middle were identified as either having 2.5 Stars or 3.5 Stars.

Below is the state captured star rating percentages for all districts with several of BCSD buildings!

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• 1 Star = 1.1%
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- 1.5 Stars = 1.5%
- 2 Stars = 6.1%
- 2.5 Stars = 12% (Central)
- 3 Stars = 15.6%
- 3.5 Stars = 18.3% (BHS, Columbus, Heskett)
- 4 Stars = 19%
- 4.5 Stars = 15.5%
- 5 Stars = 11%



As there are six Report Card Components that buildings and districts are rated on by the state of Ohio, Bedford High School received a 4-Star rating in the Progress Report Card Component. Columbus Intermediate received a 5-Star rating in the Progress Report Card Component. Additionally, Grade 5 students demonstrated Significant Evidence that the school exceeded student growth (or by a larger magnitude) in all tested subjects. Central Primary School received a 4-Star rating in the Gap Closing Report Card Component and Heskett Middle School received a 4-Star rating in the Progress Report Card Component. Carlywood Intermediate received a 2.5-Star overall rating. Glendale Primary 3-Star overall rating and 4 Star rating in the Gap Closing Component.
