"Contraband" means any unauthorized item possession of which is prohibited by District policy and/or law. It includes but is not limited to weapons and "look-alikes," alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, electronic delivery devices (e.g. vapes), controlled substances and "look-alikes," materials belonging to the school district, and stolen property.

"Reasonable suspicion" means that a school official has grounds to believe that the search will result in evidence of a violation of District policy, rules, and/or law. Reasonable suspicion may be based on a school official's personal observation, a report from a student or staff member or other individual, a student's suspicious behavior, a student's age and past history or record of conduct both in and out of the school context, an "alert" or signal received in the course of conducting a search of lockers or vehicles parked in school parking lots or property, or other reliable sources of information.	
38 39 40 41 42 43 44 45 46 47		D.	"Reasonable scope" means that the scope and/or intrusiveness of the search is reasonably related to the objectives of the search. Factors to consider in determining what is reasonable include the seriousness of the suspected infraction, the reliability of the information, the necessity of acting without delay, the existence of exigent circumstances necessitating an immediate search and further investigation (e.g. to prevent violence, serious and immediate risk of harm or destruction of evidence), and the age of the student.

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48	III.	GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY	
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50 A. Lockers and Personal Possessions within a Locker

52 Pursuant to Minnesota statute, school lockers are the property of the 53 Richfield Public Schools. At no time does the District relinguish its 54 exclusive control of lockers provided for the convenience of students. 55 Inspection of the interior of lockers may be conducted by school 56 authorities for any reason at any time, without notice, without consent, 57 and without a search warrant. The personal possessions of students 58 within a school locker may be searched only when school authorities 59 have a reasonable suspicion that the search will uncover evidence of a violation of law or school rules. As soon as practicable after the search 60 61 of a student's personal possessions, the school authorities must provide 62 notice of the search to students whose possessions were searched 63 unless disclosure would impede an ongoing investigation by police or 64 school officials.

B. Desks

School desks are the property of the District. At no time does the District relinquish its exclusive control of desks provided for the convenience of students. Inspection of the interior of desks may be conducted by school officials for any reason at any time, without notice, without consent, and without a search warrant.

C. Other Locations

Searches may be conducted in all locations where school authorities have supervisory responsibilities.

79 D. Personal Possessions and Student's Person

The personal possessions of students and/or a student's person may be searched when school officials have a reasonable suspicion that the search will uncover a violation of law or school rules. The search will be reasonable in its scope and intrusiveness.

- 86 E. It shall be a violation of this policy for students to use lockers and desks
   87 for unauthorized purposes or to store contraband. It shall be a violation
   88 for students to carry contraband on their person or in their personal
   89 possessions on school premises.
- IV. PATROLS, INSPECTIONS, AND SEARCHES OF MOTOR VEHICLES
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- A. School officials may conduct routine patrols of District locations and routine inspections of the exteriors of the motor vehicles of students. In

- addition, the interiors of motor vehicles of students in District locations
  may be searched when school officials have a reasonable suspicion that
  the search will uncover a violation of law and/or school policy or rule.
- 99B.Prohibition of Contraband and Interference with Patrols, Inspections,100Searches, and/or Seizures
  - A violation of this policy occurs when students store or carry contraband in motor vehicles in a District location or interfere with patrols, inspections, searches, and/or seizures as provided by this policy.

- 108 If a search yields contraband, school officials will take the item and may turn it 109 over to legal authorities.
- 111 VI. VIOLATIONS
- A student found to have violated this policy and/or the directives and guidelines implementing it shall be subject to discipline in accordance with Board Policy 541: Student Behavior, which may include suspension, exclusion, or expulsion, and the student may, when appropriate, be referred to legal authorities.
