

Bullying can permanently impact a child's self-esteem, confidence, and education. If you think a child is being bullied, talk to the child or an adult who can help. No child should have to suffer because they are being bullied.

The Difference between Tattling and Reporting

Students are often afraid to report what they see because they are afraid they are tattling. Children should understand the difference between tattling and reporting so they can take action when needed. Tattling is usually defined as trying to get someone else in trouble. Reporting is defined as getting help to protect someone who is being hurt or is in a dangerous situation.

How Families Can Help

- Talk to your child about bullying. Help your child understand what it means to be bullied.
- Explain the difference between tattling and reporting to your child.
 Encourage your child to report any actions that appear harmful or dangerous.
- If you see or hear about bullying at school, tell a teacher, administrator, school psychologist, social worker, or counselor.
- Download the KnowBullying app from SAMHSA.gov
- Be aware that bullying can take place through technology, especially phones and social media, and be prepared to take steps if your child is bullying or being bullied.

- Proof of identity: A current, unexpired state-issued ID or driver license. Other documentation may be accepted. Call and ask if you're not sure.

- Proof of name and date of birth: Certified birth certificate, passport (not expired), old driver license or state ID that expired no more than eight years ago.
- Proof of identity: Social Security, Forward, or Quest Card.
- Proof of Wisconsin residency: Paycheck stub, Forward or Quest Card, bank statement no more than 90 days old; must show your current address.
- Your Social Security card.
- Money: State ID: Original or renewal state ID cards are \$28; replacement state ID cards are \$16. Driver license: Original or probationary cards are \$28; renewal cards are \$34; replacement cards are \$14. Prices subject to change.

What to bring with you:

Fill out an application for a new, replacement, or corrected Social Security card (available online and at local SSA buildings). New cards are always free; replacement cards are free up to three per year and 10 per lifetime. After that you have to pay a fee.

If you are getting your own card:

- **Proof of citizenship:** Your birth certificate or current U.S. passport.
- **Proof of identity:** Your driver license, state ID, or U.S. passport.

If you are getting a card for your child:

- Proof of your own identity: See above.
- Proof of your child's identity: A doctor's medical record, religious record, child care center or school record, school ID card, or adoption decree.
- **Proof of child's citizenship:** A copy of your child's birth certificate.

If you cannot get one or more of these documents, call the number above and speak with an SSA representative before visiting the office.
