

Need a little help feeding your kids when
school is out for summer?

Learn how the new Summer EBT program can help you!

In Ohio **Summer EBT** is a new program to help families buy food for their school-aged children during the summer. Families will get \$120 for each eligible child to buy groceries during the summer. Children who get **the Summer EBT** can still participate in other summer meal programs. Receiving **the Summer EBT** will not affect children or families immigration status.

How does Summer EBT work?

In Ohio, **Summer EBT** will be **loaded onto an EBT card and mailed to your home; added to an existing household SNAP/WIC EBT card, etc.** If eligible, you can use **Summer EBT** benefits to buy food like fruits, vegetables, meat, whole grains, and dairy at grocery stores, farmers markets, and other places that accept **WIC or SNAP** EBT benefits. **Summer EBT** is a convenient way for you to help your children thrive.

Is my child eligible for Summer EBT?

Your child is eligible for **Summer EBT** if:

- Your household already participates in **SNAP, TANF, etc., OR**
- Your child attends a school that offers the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program, *and* your household income meets the requirements for free or reduced-price school meals.
- If you received free/reduced lunch during the 23/24 sy you automatically qualify. If you are unsure, contact Jackie Hess, Food Service Director @ jacqueline.hess@bellevueschools.org
