Need a little help feeding your kids when school is out for summer?

Learn how the new Summer EBT program can help you!

In Ohio Summer EBT is a new program to help families buy food for their school-aged children during the summer. Families will get \$120 for each eligible child to buy groceries during the summer. Children who get the Summer EBT can still participate in other summer meal programs. Receiving the Summer EBT will not affect children or families immigration status.



In Ohio, Summer EBT will be loaded onto an EBT card and mailed to your home; added to an existing household SNAP/WIC EBT card, etc. If eligible, you can use Summer EBT benefits to buy food like fruits, vegetables, meat, whole grains, and dairy at grocery stores, farmers markets, and other places that accept WIC or SNAP EBT benefits. Summer EBT is a convenient way for you to help your children thrive.

Is my child eligible for Summer EBT?

Your child is eligible for Summer EBT if:

- Your household already participates in **SNAP, TANF, etc.,** *OR*
- Your child attends a school that offers the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program, *and* your household income meets the requirements for free or reduced-price school meals.
- If you received free/reduced lunch during the 23/24 sy you automatically qualify. If you are unsure, contact Jackie Hess, Food Service Director @ jacqueline.hess@bellevueschools.org
