

Professional Learning Day

Oct. 13 was one of three professional learning days (PLD) for the 2023-24 school year, and schools were closed to students while district teachers, paraeducators, and administrators spent the day listening, learning, and planning for the future. High school and middle school staff gathered at their respective schools, while elementary schools hosted staff from across the district, broken into groups by grade and position. Each option school--WIN, Three Springs High School, and Home Works!--met together as well, working together in the morning while breaking off into their respective schools in the afternoon. Proficiency scales were the day's focus as educators worked to update scales based on priority standards. These scales provide a way for students to demonstrate their knowledge in each subject based on the standard levels for each subject. District paraeducators came together to connect and learn more about de-escalation strategies and building relationships. It was a great day spent improving the educational experience for all the district's students.
