

Growing Young Men & Women of Distinction

The Campus Ministry Department at TG has always played a role in developing student leaders, and helping all students grow stronger in their faith. How has this group continued to grow and engage such impressive numbers (more than 120 student ministers this year alone)? Has the dynamic of the group



changed and what does that mean for the future? We sat down with Andrew Blake ('99), Director of Mission and Ministry, to learn more about the past, present, and future of TG's Campus Ministry Department.

How does Campus Ministry strengthen and encourage TG students to grow in their relationship with God?

It is such a gift to be a school community, gathered in faith, in pursuit of God's invitation that we might be people of service to the world around us! This year, our students have been called to be models of gospel love, to live lives that are healthy and holy, and to know themselves as being created for the glory of God and others.

Post-COVID, we are seeing more and more students coming into TG with a wonderfully strong foundational relationship with God - thanks in large part to our Catholic and Christian grade school partners, parishes, and parents alike. I mention that because walking through our doors with the foundational understanding of who they are in their faith, allows us in the Campus Ministry Department to encourage a formational faith exploration. High school is a great time for that and with so many ways to get involved (service immersion, daily prayer, weekly Mass, food drives, etc.) we pride ourselves on that formational faith piece.

How is a formational faith experience at TG possibly different from what students might be getting at home or in their local parish?

Over the last 5-10 years, the TG Campus Ministry Department has increasingly embraced the five core Lasallian principles - *faith in the presence of God, respect for all people, quality education, inclusive community, and concern for the poor and social justice* - have always been a part of who TG is, but we are really making a concerted effort to take something we've always known and go further with it.

This is my answer when asked "why Catholic education?" Now, more than ever, faith needs to be both foundational and formational. Where we can partner with and work hand-in-hand with parents and parishes is helping these young people be strong in themselves and in their faith.

For us, we get them every day a parish may not. Naming and knowing kids is easier for us because they are seeking us out, raising their hand and saying "I want to go deeper in my relationship with God here." Our ultimate goal would be for young people to leave us and go on to their colleges, relationships, parishes, jobs and ask "how can I be a person of faith *because* of my high school experience and the ways I learned to make a difference?"

How are TG students learning this in the Campus Ministry Program? Through a Lasallian lens and from the TG Campus Ministry Office, we have



really tried to put some intentionality around building a community that sees and respects others. Serving, not just through campus ministry or on a service immersion trip, but through all of our classes, teams, clubs, and interactions. Service is sewn into the fabric of TG.

I am always telling students, "be significant, not just successful." All schools want their students to be successful, as they should, but we ask TG students to dig a bit deeper. How can we live lives of impact and impact others?

How are TG students positively impacting others?

So many ways - truly too many to list - but I think there are a few outstanding examples that illustrate the idea of service being formational.

As part of our junior retreats this year, we partnered with Second Harvest Heartland. Second Harvest works with 423 agency partners and 1,115 programs across a 59-county

area in Minnesota and western Wisconsin. Sometimes, service feels intimidating or like it needs to be "bigger" or have a global lens. While those forms of service continue to be important there is something critical about showing our students the need in our own backyard.

Packing meals for our own community, for the unseen poor. Those that, if you're not intentional about seeing, you will miss them. When we get there and our students are told who they are packing food for, it hits them. We've had groups packing food for the working poor, senior citizens, refugees, those with chronic illnesses, kids in need of snacks at school - it is about so much more than food. It's about helping those in crisis find stability. That kind of service, especially for kids, has an incredible impact.

What is your hope for TG's Campus Ministry Program?

Our hope is not to give our kids the

answers, it's to show them unique ways to respond to people in need and ask the right questions.

We don't know the challenges that our kids will face and the world is getting more complicated all the time, but we can help them open their hearts. There is a rigidity in high school right now that is very heavy and puts a lot on our kids. We are trying to tap into that and say, "see the forest - not just the tree." Sometimes, just giving them a place to move out of a task-driven environment and open their hearts to God is all it takes. Campus Ministry is that place for our students. Sometimes they just need to slow down, have someone listen to them, and have a cup of coffee...their coffee just comes with a lot more milk, cream, flavored syrups, and sugar.

That's a long way to say, my hope for the program is that if you are someone that is seeking a deeper relationship with God - you will find it at TG.

MARK SITARZ '88

2024 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

The Totino-Grace High School Distinguished Alumni Award honors alumni who have made a distinct contribution in their field of profession and who serve as positive role models. 




