We have all witnessed at different levels the havoc COVID-19 has wreaked on our nation and how the virus has impacted individuals, families, and our community (health and well-being, the economy, schools, etc.). Although 2020 has challenged our community and region, as superintendent I am approaching 2021 with a sense of optimism and hope as we plan for the future of our school district. While we must not let our guard down as we continue to live with the COVID-19 virus, we must also remember that the pandemic is temporary and that at some point "this too shall pass". Thus, as 2020 draws to a close and the beginning of a new year approaches, I am committing to looking and pushing ahead.

A significant aspect of looking ahead is planning for the return of additional students to our schools. In recent weeks groups of teachers and central office and building administrators have teamed to consider hybrid learning options for grades 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12. The goal of this work is to create a specific plan for each of these grade bands that can be shared with our Board of Directors on December 16th and with parents as they consider the best learning option for their student(s) (continue in distance learning or return to in-person instruction when possible).

We will continue to work with the regional health district as we analyze the COVID-19 situation in our community and region and make decisions related to reopening our schools for in-person learning. We recently shared tentative return dates (3rd grade 1/11/21, 4th-5th grade one to two weeks after 3rd grade, and 6th-12th grade at semester 2/1/21), and will attempt to finalize timelines and communicate specific information with families as soon as possible. Since the return of 3rd grade is scheduled first, we will communicate specific information to parents of 3rd grade students prior to break and by Friday, December 18th at the latest. Knowing that many factors can change between December 18th and January 11th, the information received prior to break will be a tentative plan to be confirmed after winter break.

In addition to our reopening focus, planning for the future of our schools includes replacement EP&O and capital levy propositions that will be on the February 9th ballot for voter consideration. If approved by voters, the levy propositions will be for the years 2022, 2023, and 2024 and will replace the existing EP&O and capital levies that expire in 2021. In the coming weeks the district will provide a levy informational flier within our school district and schedule webinars to provide additional information to our community. Details related to the dates, times, and how to participate in levy webinars will be provided soon.

Although this has been a very stressful time, my sincere hope is that each and every family had an enjoyable and safe Thanksgiving and will have a joyful holiday season. 
