I want to thank all of our students, parents and guardians, and staff members for all your hard work, flexibility, and willingness to work together as we begin the school year in a distance learning model. We have experienced some difficulties and a few bumps in the road, and there has also been a lot of excitement as students reconnect with staff members and peers. I saw this firsthand last Tuesday as I had the opportunity to visit each school and observe teachers engage in teaching and learning activities with students in our virtual platform.

Although we are beginning the school year in a distance learning model, we continue to meet weekly with the Spokane Regional Health District and closely monitor the COVID-19 situation within the county. As of September 10th, the rate of new COVID-19 cases per 100,000 county residents over a two-week period was down to 98 and approaching the moderate range. Just over a month ago this number was approximately 230. As a reminder, a county is considered to have high COVID-19 activity at 75 new cases and above and the moderate range for activity is between 25-75 cases. The moderate range provides school districts with the opportunity to initiate plans to phase some students back onto campus. In discussions with the health department, it is important that the COVID-19 numbers stay below 75 cases per 100k residents for several weeks before districts begin the phase in process. A consistent trend over time is critical so that we can avoid jumping in and out of in-person or distance learning models and create as much stability as possible for students, staff, and families. We will continue to provide regular COVID-19 updates, and any changes to our instructional model will be communicated well in advance of implementation.

I understand beginning the school year in a distance learning model has created many unique challenges for everyone. Please know that I want (and our district wants) our students to physically be in our schools as soon as possible. We are committed to reopening our buildings to in-person learning when the COVID-19 data demonstrates that it is safe to do so and through consultation with our regional health district.

During this uncertain time I remain extremely hopeful because I know this situation is temporary. Six months ago our schools were completely closed and now we have staff members back on campus, we will begin to bring small cohorts of students in need of the most support back to buildings this week, and the COVID-19 data within our county and region is improving. As a system we WILL continue to work hard and are committed to doing our very best to meet the academic and social and emotional needs of each and every student. I appreciate your patience, grace, and support while we continue to navigate the ongoing health crisis and implement our conditional reopening plan.
