Parents, Guardians and Community Members,

In February of 2017 the voters of the Cheney School District passed a \$52,000,000 bond to provide expansion, renovation, and safety upgrades to Cheney High School, expansion and safety improvements to Betz, Sunset, and Windsor Elementary Schools, and a secure entry-way at Salnave Elementary. Following months of design and planning, construction has begun on two of our projects, and will begin soon on the remaining three.

Installation of the secure entryway at Salnave Elementary began over spring break, and is expected to be completed in the next several weeks. The new entryway routes visitors through the main office and provides the building's main entrance with additional security and lockdown capabilities.

Recently, construction has also started at Betz Elementary, where a new classroom wing will be added to the north side of the building, several restrooms will be added to existing classrooms to be utilized for preschool and kindergarten, and the main entry to the building will be renovated to provide a secure entryway. The project at Betz was awarded to Leone and Keeble Inc. and is expected to be completed by August of 2018, in time for the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year.

Expansion and safety improvements at Sunset Elementary are scheduled to begin very soon. Recently, the project was awarded to T.W. Clark Construction. Once construction begins, we are estimating completion of the work by July of 2019. The Windsor Elementary project was recently bid, and the award of the contract will be considered at the upcoming April 18 School Board meeting. The estimated completion date for the Windsor project is also July of 2019.

Lastly, the high school is a General Contractor/Construction Manager project which has allowed our architects (ALSC Architects) to work with our construction firm (Lydig Construction) on the design and development of the project. Currently, we are working towards the construction document approval phase. The expansion, renovation, and safety upgrades at the high school are scheduled to begin this summer and run through the summer of 2020.

The beginning of construction is an exciting time in our district. Throughout the process we will continue to provide updates to share the progress and completion timelines for each of our projects.
