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Commercial growth in our area


Continued commercial growth in our area is a key driver to our local economic growth. Recently, Spokane County identified the ten largest contributors within the District on the basis of their 2016 tax collection assessed valuation. The companies included Caterpillar Inc., United Technologies/ Goodrich, and Eagle Point Apartments—none of which were even listed in our tax base as recently as five years ago.





In addition, other commercial sites in the District are currently under construction. Exotic Metals is nearing completion on its \$25 million, 150,000 square foot building in Airway Heights, which will house 150 new employees.

Seattle-based Seaport Steel is adding a \$6.9 million, 60,000 square foot building at its satellite facility in Airway Heights which will generate 20 new jobs; and Pennsylvania-based Keystone Automotive Operations Inc. built a new distribution center in Airway Heights that is expected to employ 60 people.



Our district continues to grow

We are pleased that our surrounding communities remain attractive to those relocating to our region. Enrollment grew by more than 1,000 students between 2005 and 2015. Cohort projections indicate a similar pattern of growth will continue for the foreseeable future.

More and more families are choosing to live on the Greater West Plains, and to send their children to the Cheney Public Schools. We welcome them, and are in the process of planning to accommodate this growth, and to serve their future needs.
